My son starts school today. It is all going to be strange and new to him for a while and I wish you would treat him gently. It is an adventure that might take him across continents. All adventures that probably include wars, tragedy and sorrow. To live this life will require faith, love and courage.

So dear Teacher, will you please take him by his hand and teach him things he will have to know, teaching him – but gently, if you can. Teach him that for every enemy, there is a friend. He will have to know that all men are not just, that all men are not true. But teach him also that for every scoundrel there is a hero that for every crooked politician, there is a dedicated leader.

Teach him if you can that 10 cents earned is of far more value than a dollar found. In school, teacher, it is far more honourable to fail than to cheat. Teach him to learn how to gracefully lose, and enjoy winning when he does win.

Teach him to be gentle with people, tough with tough people. Steer him away from envy if you can and teach him the secret of quiet laughter. 9. Continuing the successful publication of the school's monthly magazine, **"Inkspire,"** fostering creativity, literary expression, and student voice.
10. Implementing structured initiatives to improve **students' mental health and overall well-being**, ensuring a safe, supportive, and nurturing learning environment.
11. Promoting strong **teacher collaboration, professional development, and continuous capacity building**, thereby strengthening instructional quality and institutional growth.

OUR EXPECTATIONS

- Courtesy and respect must be the key aspects of a pupil's behavior. Disrespect and disobedience may result in disciplinary action, involving suspension of the student.
- Students are expected to greet all visitors and members of the staff with respect. They should remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
- Silence must be maintained during class hours.
- Indisciplined behaviour in school bus will render a student ineligible for using the school transportation.
- All the students are responsible to the school authorities for the behavior both in and out of the school.
- Care should be taken to keep the school premises clean.
- Care should be taken of all the school property. No student should scratch or spoil the desks or chairs or damage any schools furniture, write or draw anything on the curtains & walls. Any damage made should be reported to the class teacher and have to be compensated.
- All the students are expected to duly complete the Students' Profile on (Page no.2) in the Almanac within 3 days of its receipt. A recent photograph and Parents' signatures are mandatory.
- Every student is supposed to wear the Identity Card provided by the school.
- Students are supposed to bring this almanac daily to the school.
- Clean and neatly dressed students are appreciated. We expect that no child will write slogans or scribble anything on the school uniform.
- All the students are expected to value school property.
- Shouting and whistling are strictly prohibited.
- We expect no student to bring sharp objects like knives, Steel Scale, Cutter, Mobiles, Perfume and makeup item to school.
- Students are advised to keep their class rooms, buses, school building and campus spic and span.
- We expect students not to bring valuable articles like expensive watches, fancy

and costly pens and jewellery to school.

- Students, who commute in the care of escorts, should never leave the school before the escorts arrive. In case of delay, students should contact the school office.
- We believe that every child needs space and freedom to develop his/her fullest potential but it should be remembered that others too need the same.
- Students found tampering with the school records eg: marks allotted by teachers in tests / exams are liable to strict disciplinary actions .
- Changing classrooms between periods should be done in silence and in a disciplined manner.
- Students should be clean and neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn everyday and for all school functions. Students who are sloppily dressed or not in the complete uniform will be not allowed to board the bus.
- No books (other than text books or library books), magazines, pen drive, cassettes, CDs, money, mobile phones, camera may be brought to school without the Principal's permission.
- Lending or borrowing money and other articles is not permitted.
- SGIS Students should observe polite standards, wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their behavior. Bullying and using foul language are punishable offences. Since it is a co-ed school, it is expected that students behave in a manner, which brings a good name to the school community. They should not indulge in any anti-social activity, in or outside the school.

No student shall indulge in any of the following practices:

1. Spitting in or near the school building.
2. Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property.
3. Smoking.
4. Any form of gambling.
5. Use of drugs or intoxicants except on prescription by a practitioner/Doctor.
6. Rowdy & rude behavior.
7. Use of violence in any form.
8. Casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability.

- The student is expected to come prepared with his difficulties to facilitate clarification, teaching.
- The observance of rules of discipline of the school and good behavior is an essential condition to the student's continuation in the school. In case any student violates the school rules or indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict action like expulsion / suspension, rustication shall be taken against the student.
- Bursting of crackers and playing with colours and any other such unwanted activity is liable to lead to expulsion of a student from the school.
- Self discipline is the forte of the school.
- Parents are not permitted to take away the child during the school hours for any reason and without prior permission.
- No student will be allowed to go home without a written permission from the Principal.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS CONCERNING SCHOOL TRANSPORT

1. Students will be picked up at the scheduled time in the morning at their regular bus stops.
2. Students will be dropped off at their designated bus stops at the time of the 4:00 p.m. departure.
3. Only the 5:30 p.m. drop-off will be at their fixed points specified by the transport department for the students. No home drop is applicable for the students.
4. Changing of buses will not be entertained.
5. The KG bus facility at 1:00 p.m. will not be allowed for students, except in cases of health issues or emergencies with the approval of a school doctor.
6. Students Staying for extra classes and sports will be dropped at selected spots and parents to pickup from there.
7. Any Issue regarding transport to be informed to the school admin officer and the transport manager on the given numbers.
8. Parents to reach the bus stop before 5 minutes from the allotted time.
9. The School bus will not wait for late comers.

10. If parents do not report on time at the dropping point they have to pick up the child from the next point.
11. Parents are intimated to maintain the timing slots for timely running of the school transport.
12. If any parents have concerns regarding the transport facility, they are requested to communicate directly with the Transport Department. Parents are not permitted to enter the bus to address or resolve such issues directly. Such an approach is not acceptable to the school management. Parents are advised to kindly follow the proper communication procedure.

Guidelines for Students While Travelling in the School Bus

1. Students must follow the instructions given by the bus attendant and driver at all times.
2. A strict no-touch policy must be followed by all students during bus travel.
3. Students must occupy the seats allotted by the bus attendant and should not change seats without permission.
4. Students must not throw plastic, paper or any kind of garbage from the bus window.
5. Screaming, shouting or howling inside the bus is strictly prohibited.
6. Eating or carrying eatables in the school bus is not permitted.
7. Bullying, teasing, or making inappropriate or disrespectful comments towards fellow classmates will not be tolerated. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against such behaviour.
8. Students must refrain from bullying, passing comments, using abusive language or making any inappropriate remarks towards outside passengers. Such behavior will not be tolerated.

Note:

If any student fails to follow the above Code of Conduct, the student will receive three warnings. If the behaviour continues, the student will be suspended from the school bus service.

AIMS

The School aims to achieve the following :

1. To impart the best academic curriculum to prepare students' admission to universities in India and abroad.
2. To provide outstanding teaching resources – such that students experience all round academic, intellectual, social, cultural, physical, emotional and spiritual development, through a well- rounded curriculum.
3. To impart the right values to students including teamwork, motivation, sensitivity and compassion and practical applied learning.

The School will emphasize the following :

1. Perseverance in “the pursuit of academic excellence”
2. Acceptance of personal responsibility
3. Concern for others
4. Compassion for those from different race, religion and social background
5. An ethical approach to all aspects of life.
6. Respect for integrity and truth
7. Team work

10. Community service & responsibility towards the less privileged
11. Lasting commitment to international co-operation and readiness promote this cause actively throughout their lives.

Disciplinary Policy

All students are expected to actively contribute towards maintaining a positive, supportive, safe, and welcoming environment for both students and staff within the school.

Any student who is persistently, repeatedly, or wilfully involved in misconduct, malpractice, or behaviour that negatively influences fellow students may be subjected to disciplinary action. Based on the severity of the offence, the concerned authority may issue a **Blue Card, Yellow Card or Red Card** after a thorough review and investigation conducted by the Disciplinary Committee.

The disciplinary actions may include a verbal warning, a written warning, a parent meeting, suspension for five days, suspension for one month, and expulsion in serious cases. All decisions will be taken by the school authorities after a careful and fair evaluation of the situation.

BLUE CARD (CRITERIA 1)

1. Improper Uniform (includes civil shoes & socks, fancy haircut & hair color, hair gel, nail polish, tattoo, jewellery, mehndi, bindi, accessories, makeup, untrimmed nails, dirty or un-ironed clothes, not wearing ID cards etc.);
2. Bringing prohibited items to school (Mobiles, CDs, cameras any fancy gifts or expensive items, electronic gadgets and equipment, food items (without prior permission), money (without specific notice from the school) etc.;
3. Truancy (Absenteeism without permission);
4. Irregularity in academic activities;
5. Disrespect to teachers;
6. Hooting or hollering in school premises;
7. Use of cricket bats, hockey sticks and other games equipment inside the classroom;

Note: Defaulters who are recipients of the blue card are subject to deduction of marks in the Midterm/Annual Examination as the Disciplinary committee may deem fit. Depending upon the gravity of the situation parents of the student may be called to school.

(This card is issued by the coordinator in consultation with the Class teacher and Subject teacher)

YELLOW CARD (CRITERIA 2)

1. Use of inappropriate and abusive language;
2. Leaving school premises without permission;
3. Using unfair means in examinations;
4. Stealing or damaging school properties;
5. Teenage issues;
6. Writing abusive words on desks, walls or any other school property or willfully damaging school property.
7. While travelling on school buses, throwing anything out of windows; shouting or bullying schoolmates or pedestrians;
8. No-Touch Policy: Students are strictly prohibited from touching one another within the school premises.

Note: Defaulters who are recipients of the yellow card are subject to deduction of marks in the Midterm/Annual Examination as the Disciplinary committee may deem fit. Depending upon the gravity of the situation parents of the student may be called to school.

(This card is issued by the Vice-Principal in consultation with Coordinators)

RED CARD (CRITERIA 3)

1. Immoral/unethical acts in the school premises;
2. Misuse of social media by posting negative comments/images about School, Classmates and Teachers;
3. Serious manhandling of students;
4. Use of E Cigarette or any other components of addiction or intoxication in School Campus and Bus;
5. Any other offence of serious nature like smoking/drinking in the school premises or bringing obscene literature to School.

Note: Defaulters who are recipients of the red card are subject to suspension or expulsion from school for any number of day/days as the Principal deems fit.

PARENTS ARE REQUESTED TO ADHERE TO THESE TENETS

- Parents should co-operate with the teachers and school in educating their child.
- Parents should sign all remarks/ notices sent by the teacher
- Signing of remarks indicates that you have read the remark.
- Parents should not give any eatables or expensive things to the child.
- English must be the communicative language for children and parents should encourage the child to speak in English.
- Parents are informed to attend all meetings and certain activities / events whenever invited.
- Parents should attend the Open Parents Day and find out the progress of their child.
- Parents are advised not to ask for leave during Tests and Exams
- Please read carefully and file every circular, monthly syllabus or portion sheet that is sent from school.
- Please do not send money/ fees through your child.
- On Birthdays a child can wear coloured clothes. Children are not allowed to bring cake or chocolates to school.
However, children are advised to donate a plant sapling or a book to the school on their birthdays.

- Parents are informed to fill up information in the school diary.
- In case of any change in your office or residence address, phone number etc, please inform school authorities promptly, in writing or through mail.
- Please avoid applying for half day leave for security reasons. In case of an emergency, a written request to the Principal is mandatory.
- Children, when sick, especially afflicted by contagious diseases, should not be sent to school. In that case a leave application, in the prescribed format given in the almanac, should be sent to the school.
- A child afflicted with any contagious disease should come to school only after recovering along with a fitness certificate from reliable authority.
- Please ensure that name, class, section and admission number of the pupil is marked on all the belongings of the student.
- Regularity and punctuality are our success mantras. Help the child to master them as early as possible.
- Please ensure that students are not wearing earrings, necklace, chain or other jewellery. Girls can wear only small studs. No student should use nail polish or tattoos.
- SGI school is your school. We need your feedback and support. You are most welcome to meet Class teachers, Class Coordinators and other concerned staff. The Vice-Principal & Principal is always eager to interact with you.
- Imparting health education is very important. Please ensure that the child follows a good daily routine and becomes a model for his/her siblings.
- Maintains proper hygiene
- Please help the child to be self-dependent. Always be available to help, and avoid spoon feeding.
- Children are gullible. Criticizing the teacher and school in their presence should be avoided. We will welcome your discussion as a stakeholder for the betterment of the institution .Together we can do the best for the children .
- And, finally, please say NO !!! to “Private Tuition!”

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS FOR ONLINE SECURITY

(To monitor use of internet by children)

- By taking responsibility of your children's online computer use, parents can greatly minimize any potential risks. Make it a family rule to :
- Never give out identifying information – home address, school name, Telephone no. or any other personal information on social media and be sure you are dealing someone that both you and your children know and trust.
- Being a Parent, they should be aware about the social media platform which child is using. Parents should find out what types of information offers and whether there are ways for parents to block out objectionable material.
- Never respond to any messages on social media that are suggesting obscene, aggressive threatening, or make you feel uncomfortable. If you or your child receives a message that is harassing, of an obscene nature, or threatening, forward a copy of the message to your surveillance provider and ask for assistance.
- Remember that people online may not be who they seem because you can't see or even hear the person as it would be easy for someone misrepresent him/herself. Thus, someone indicating that “she” is “12-year-old-girl” could in reality be a 40 year old man.
- Set reasonable rules and guidelines for your children's computer use. Discuss these rules with them and place a copy near the computer as a reminder. Make sure to monitor whether they follow these rules, especially regarding the amount of time they spend on the computer. Excessive use of online services, chat rooms particularly late at night—may indicate a potential problem. Remember that personal computers and online services should not be used as electronic babysitters.
- Consider keeping the computer in the family room rather than in your child's bedroom. Get to know your children's online friends just as you would get to know their other friends.
- Posting defamatory content about the school, faculty or any of the stakeholders is strictly prohibited. Anyone who violates this rule will face disciplinary action under cyber laws.

- Ensure your child uses internet and social media in a responsible manner.
- Encourage your child to have more creative and physical activities rather than spending time on gadgets. Let your child follow the below etiquettes:
 - I will not give out personal information such as my address, telephone number, parent's work address/telephone number, or the name and location of my school without my parent's permission.
 - I will tell my parents right away if I come across any information that makes me feel uncomfortable.
 - I will never meet someone I have met online without first informing and getting permission from my parents. If they agree, the meeting will take place in a public location, and one of my parents will accompany me. I will never send my picture or share any personal information with someone online without first discussing it with my parents.
 - I will not respond to any messages that are mean or in any way make me feel uncomfortable. It is not my fault if I get a message like that. If I do, I will tell my parents right away so that they can contact the online service.
 - I will talk with my parents so that we can set up rules for going online. We will decide upon the time of day that I can be online, the length of time I can be online and appropriate areas for me to visit. I will not access other areas or break these rules without their permission.

GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDANCE & WITHDRAWAL:

- It is compulsory for the students to avail minimum 90 % of the attendance.
- Parents should send leave applications in the given format, in advance whenever possible.
- Leave can be granted on prior information but the reason / ground should be reasonable enough. An application can be sent through the bus driver / attendant or the class teacher can be contacted over the phone, followed by the application at the earliest opportunity.
- The student, returning to the school after suffering from an infectious/ contagious disease, should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting her / him to join the school.

- Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to the class .

Chicken pox	: Till complete falling of the scabs.
Cholera	: Till the child has completely recovered.
Measles	: Two weeks after the rashes disappear.
Mumps	: Until the swelling has gone, about one month.
Whooping Cough	: Six weeks.
Hepatitis	: Six weeks.
Covid	: 14 days

A repeated absence or unexplained absence for more than six consecutive days and more than three days immediately after a vacation renders the student liable to have his / her name struck off the rolls. Readmission may be granted only on the payment of fresh admission fee.

WITHDRAWAL

1. Three calendar months' notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice must be given before the pupil can be withdrawn.
2. The completed withdrawal form should be submitted to the school office.
3. Transfer certificate is not issued until all dues of the school are cleared.

DISMISSAL

Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds.

1. Constant failure of payment of the fee before the due date.
2. Absence from the school for no reason or for unacceptable reasons for 20 consecutive days or 25 non-consecutive days within two months.
3. Any student who fails to follow the Disciplinary Code of Conduct after three warnings will be asked to leave the school.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Please do not run in the library.
2. Remember to use a hushed voice so that you do not disturb others in the library.
3. Please return the books on time.
4. Respect teachers, staff members, and other students
5. For delayed submission, fines are Rs. 15 per day or the cost of the book, whichever is higher.
6. Keep the books clean, dry, and safe from pets.

BOOKS AND STATIONERY

All the books will be provided by the school through the school stores at the beginning of the session. For the purpose of uniformity, students are required to buy exercise books of the standard design bearing the name of the school. School bag will be provided by the school at the beginning of the academic year. Parents are intimated to write their wards' name on the bag, Shoes, water bottle, Jacket & all other belongings.

SCHOOL INFIRMARY

The school infirmary is staffed with a full time qualified Doctor & nurse, and is supported by Aster Aadhar hospital. The school Doctor is responsible for the routine treatment of minor injuries or illnesses. She assists the school authorities in making decisions on whether an unwell student should remain in school or go home for further health care.

If a child is on medication and is supposed to consume medicine during school hours, parents are required to intimate the school doctor. If the student has any health issues, it needs to be intimated to the doctor during the time of admission.

MEDICAL ADVICE TO PARENTS

It is important to provide accurate and up to date medical record of your child especially if the child is suffering from asthma, epilepsy, rheumatism or any heart problem. The details of the illness must be filled up in the hand book with the treatment being taken and the child should be under continuous medical

supervision of a specialist doctor

Impart health education to your child, follow a regular routine of hygiene like-

- a. Proper hair care –As to prevent lice infestation.
- b. Care of nails-regular trimming of nails.
- c. Inculcate the habit of washing hands with soap and water before each meal
- d. Brushing of teeth regularly twice a day followed by periodical visits to the dentist.
- e. De-worm you child at least once a year after consulting your doctor.
- f. Ensure that your child gets a good night's sleep of about 7-8 hours, which is not only important for his / her overall development but also stops him from feeling sleepy, lazy and sluggish during school hours.
- g. Caution your child from eating at road side eateries, specially ice-cream or any other milk products.
- h. Make exercise an integral part of your child's daily routine.

TOURS AND EXCURSIONS

Sanjay Ghodawat International School appreciates the fact that the experience of students outside school-campus contribute to the development of their understanding, skills and attitudes. The provision of opportunities for students to learn from the wider community builds on and reinforces the school curriculum. Excursions are an important means of providing such opportunities. We conduct well planned tours and excursions for children. The calendar is drawn and parents are informed well in advance about the tours.

RULES FOR THE SWIMMING POOL

1. All swimmers will have to produce a medical certificate stating that they are medically fit for swimming.
2. The school swimming pool is a private pool and its facilities may be used only by the students and authorized members of the school.
3. Students are strictly forbidden from going near / into the pool unless a teacher or the trainer accompanies them.
4. The swimming pool facilities can only be availed on prescribed timings.

5. The swimmers should swim in proper costumes and bring with them towels, soap etc. The swimmers are not allowed to wear ornaments.
6. All swimmers should take a shower before entering the pool.
7. Nails should be short and trimmed.
8. Floating devices may be permitted into the pool by the trainer or teacher, but only of such size as to accommodate one person only. Inflatable rafts, boards and other multipurpose devices are not permitted in or around the pool.
9. Attendants / drivers / servants and any pets are not permitted in the pool premises under any circumstances.
10. Before entering the pool all students must contact the coach / trainer. The safety precautions as enforced by the lifeguard or the coach must be observed.
11. All instructions given by the coach or the authorities should be strictly followed.
12. The students are not permitted to spit either on the dock or water.
13. The school reserves the right to restrict entry (or removal from the pool premises) of any student whose behaviour, approach, manner or conduct is unacceptable to the school authorities.
14. Changes made in the regulations shall be intimated to all the students and will be binding in all circumstances.

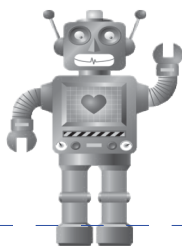

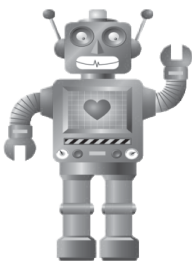
